

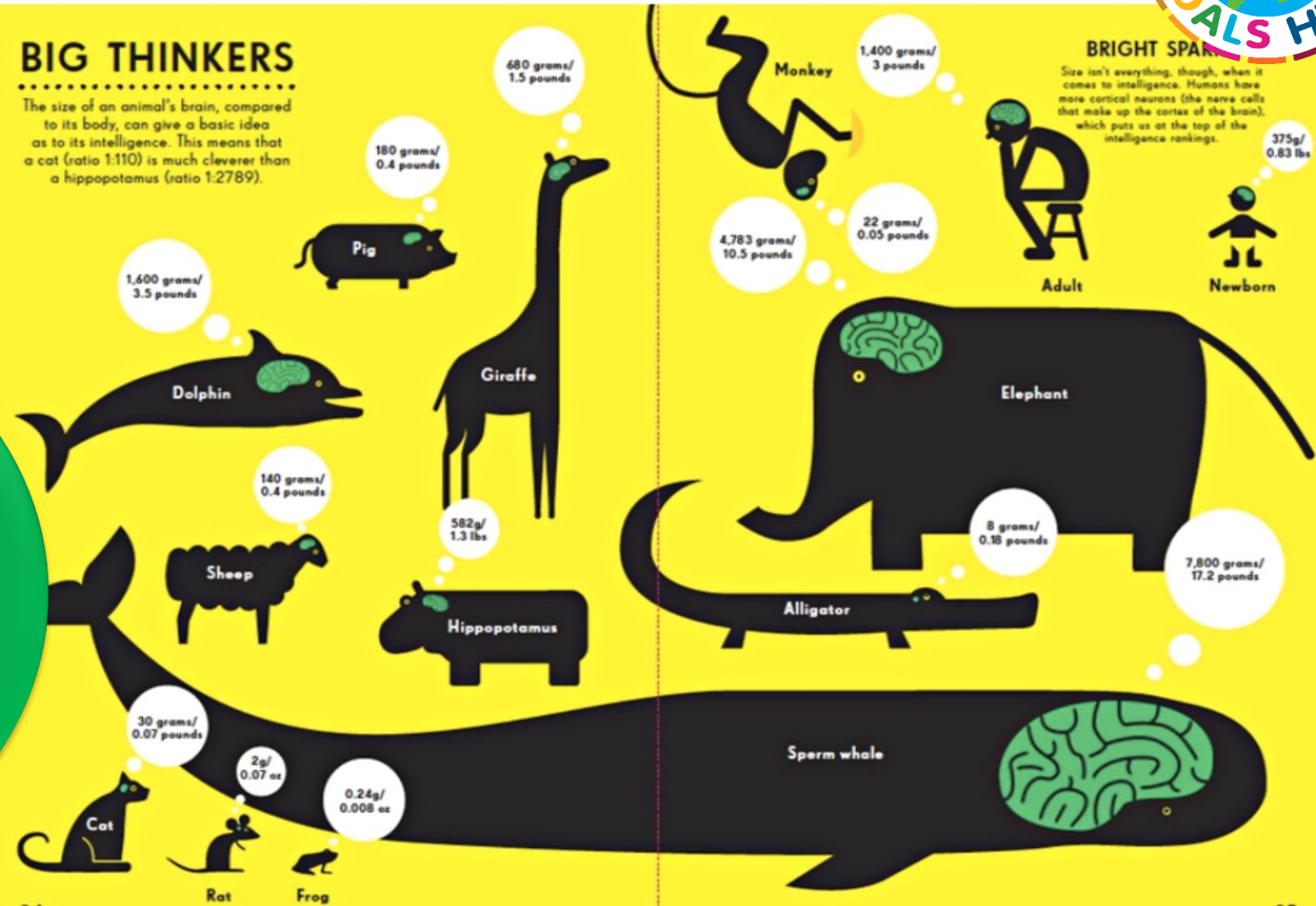


Infographics: Pictures that talk!



BIG THINKERS

The size of an animal's brain, compared to its body, can give a basic idea as to its intelligence. This means that a cat (ratio 1:110) is much cleverer than a hippopotamus (ratio 1:2789).



BRIGHT SPARKS

Size isn't everything, though, when it comes to intelligence. Humans have more cortical neurons (the nerve cells that make up the cortex of the brain), which puts us at the top of the intelligence rankings.

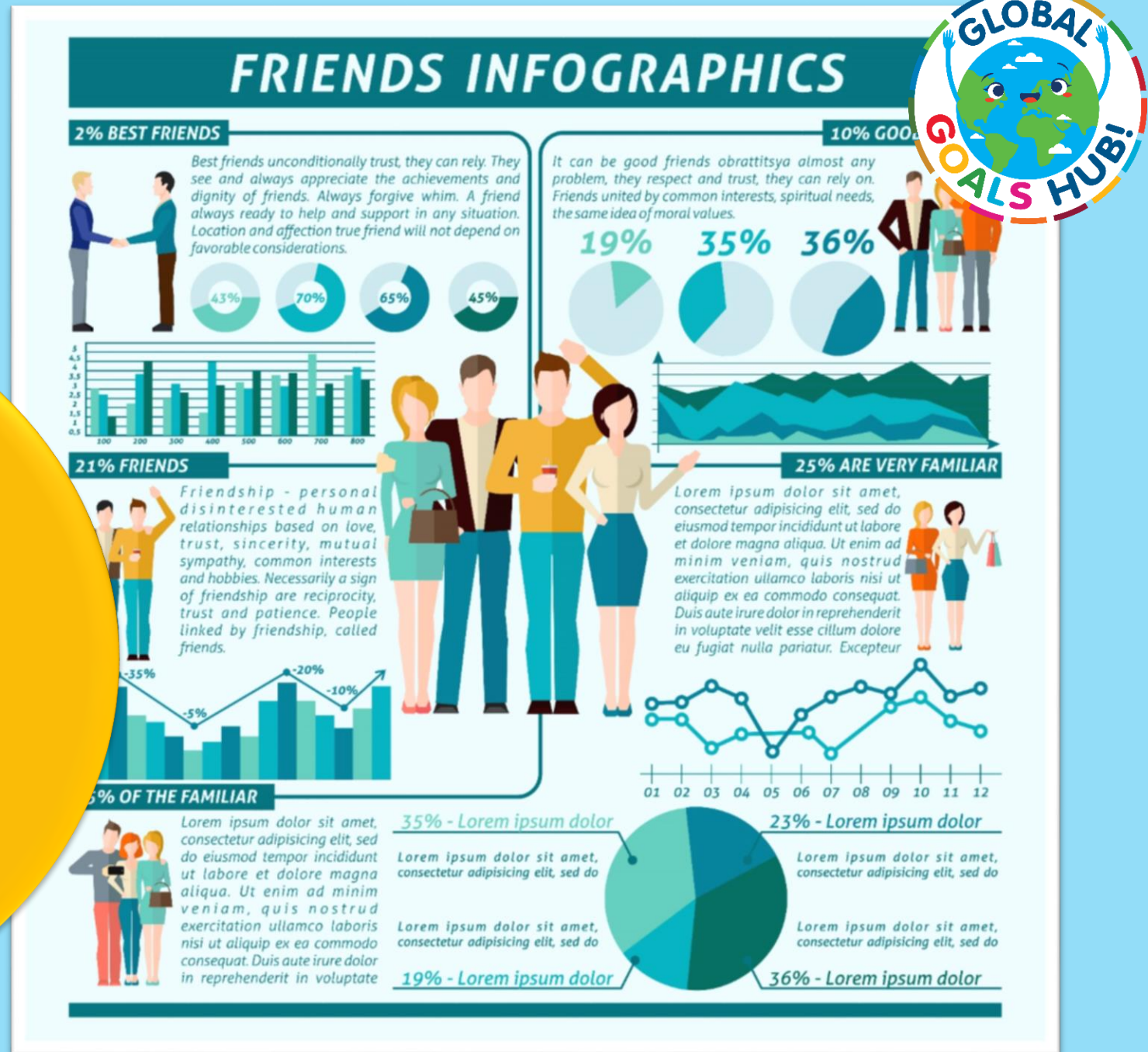


Infographics started with maps and charts many years ago.

SAVE YOUR BREATH
Some animals that live in the water don't have gills, so they have to hold their breath as they swim. But who can last the longest underwater?

* This is the longest time ever recorded for a human being. The average time a human can hold their breath is only around 1 minute.

SARDINES
One of the biggest schools of fish in the world is found off the California coast. It can be 4.5 miles/7.2 kilometres long and 1.6 kilometres wide.

The shoaling fish respond to the position of their neighbours, trying not to get too close to some and keeping far enough away from others.

At 12.5 metres/41 feet, the whale shark is the longest fish in the world.

THE SQUID AND THE WHALE SHARK
A giant squid reaches up to 18 metres/59 feet long.

When threatened, sardines (and other foraging fish) group together to create huge bait balls of up to 20 metres/65.6 feet in diameter to confuse the predators.

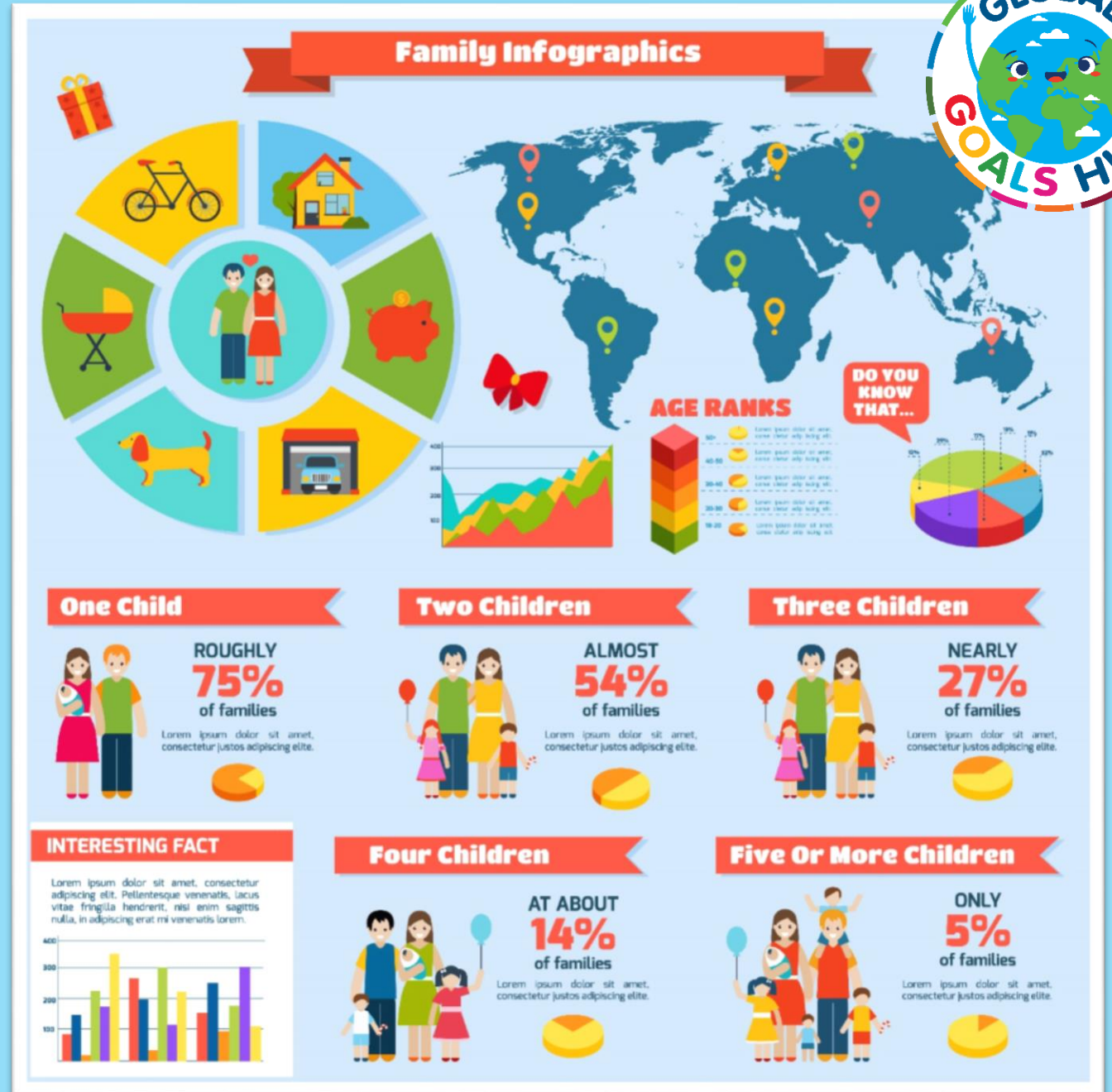
Thousands of dolphins feed on the sardines by herding groups of the fish together like sheepdogs.

“Check your spelling!”




Asperger's syndrome
Educate yourself. End the stigma.

What's Asperger's syndrome?
Asperger's syndrome is a condition that belongs in the autistic spectrum and affects the person's ability to interpret language and social cues, among other characteristics. Autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is a developmental disability caused by differences in the brain. It was described for the first time by Hans Asperger, an Austrian pediatrician.

Signs and symptoms
The symptoms of Asperger's syndrome are generally apparent after the time a child turns age 3, but may be diagnosed at a later age. Symptoms of Asperger's syndrome vary from person to person; no two symptom presentations are the same.

- Difficulties in social interactions
- Different speaking patterns
- Difficulties understanding body language
- High sensitivity to stimuli
- Resistance to change
- Very literal comprehension and use of speech
- Hyperfixation on specific topics
- Talent towards specific skills

Did you know...?
The majority with Asperger's syndrome are making a normal life for themselves.
1 in 88 children has been diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder.
Children are more likely to get diagnosed.



WHAT IS WORLD HUMANITARIAN DAY

2003 — On 19 August 2003, a bomb attack on the Canal Hotel in Baghdad killed 22 humanitarian aid workers.

2008 — Five years later, the General Assembly adopted a resolution designating 19 August as World Humanitarian Day.

This year, the already difficult work carried out by humanitarians has been made even more so by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Aid workers assist people in **54** Countries all around the globe.


This day commemorates humanitarian workers killed and injured in the course of their work, and we honour all aid and health workers who continue, to provide life-saving support and protection to people most in need.

- 42.0M** livestock reached with vaccination and treatment campaigns.
- 32.2M** people provided with access to safe water for drinking, cooking and personal hygiene.
