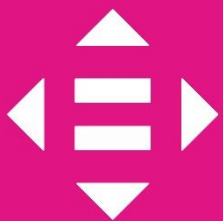

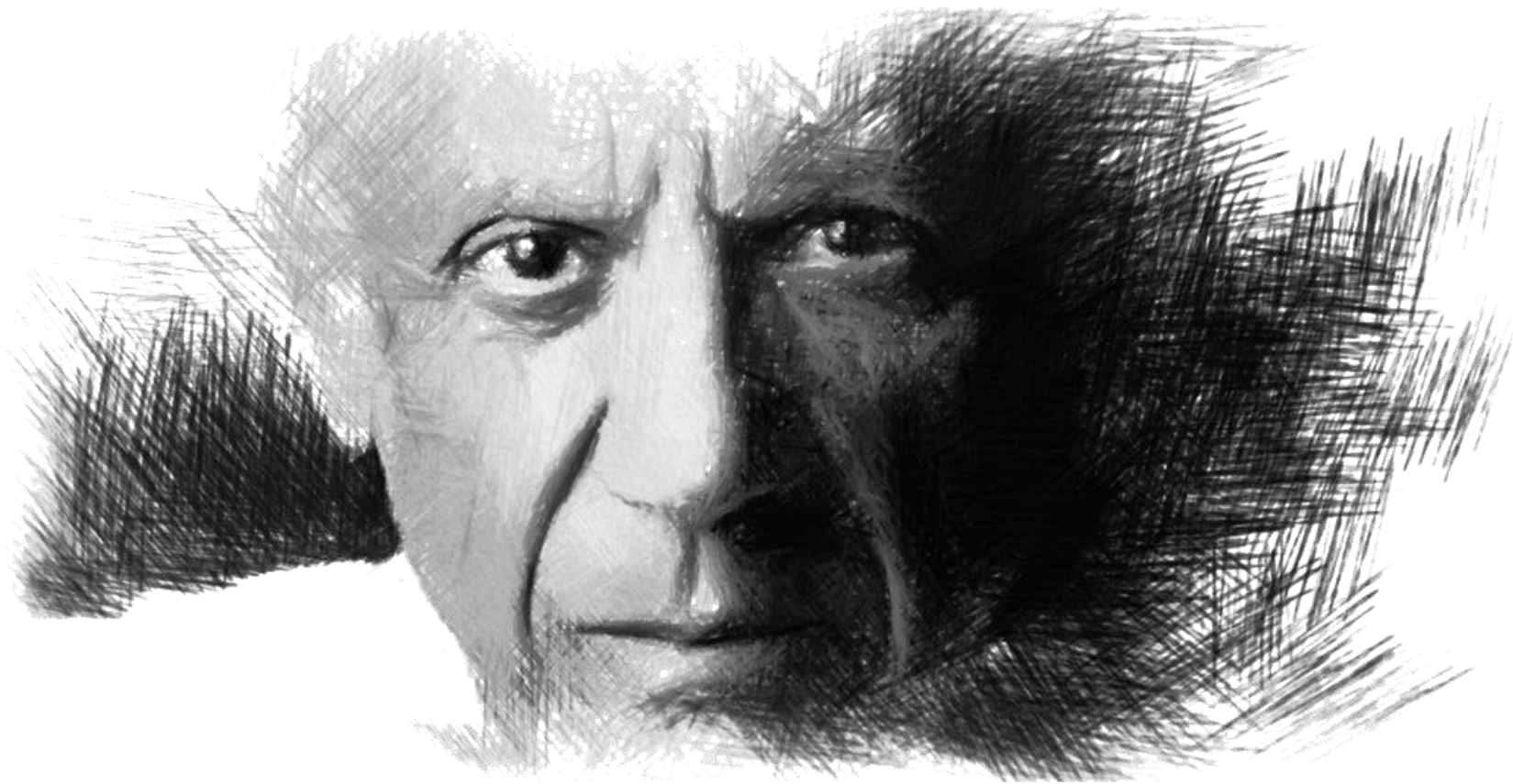

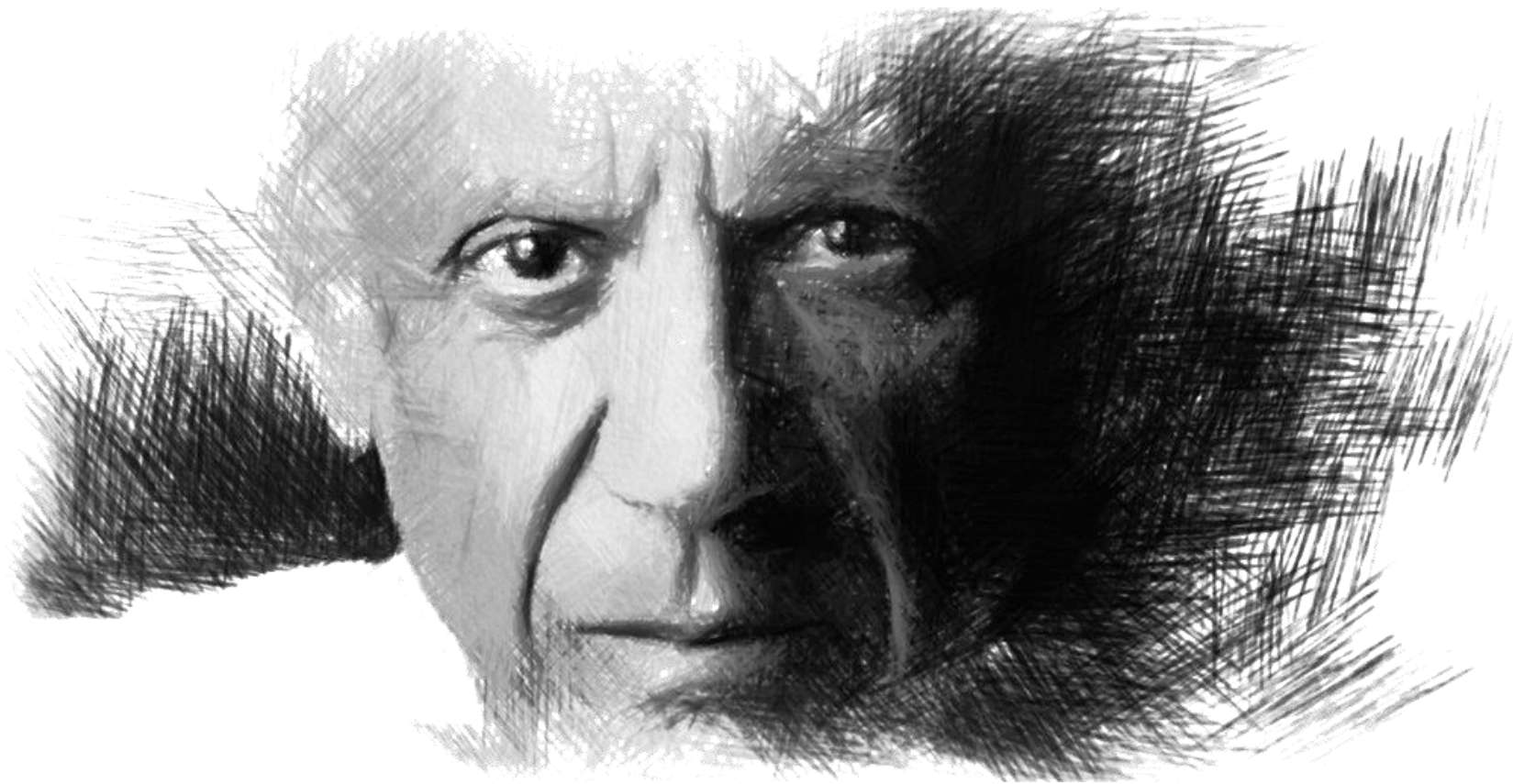

**“ Pablo was a Spanish painter and sculptor.
He is one of the most famous artists of the 20th century.”**

**“He is best known for making people see art in a new way.
He helped create a new style called **Cubism**.
In Cubism objects are shown from many different angles
at the same time.”**



**“ Pablo claimed:
Painting is not meant to decorate apartments.
It is a tool to fight against problems and enemies.”**

**“He meant that:
Art is a weapon, but it is not for causing death.
It can be used to bring peace.”**



One of his most powerful paintings, “Guernica” (1937), shows the pain and horror of war and became a symbol of peace and freedom all around the world.



**The painting is huge - 3.5m high and 7.8m long!
It is black, white, and gray - symbolizing sadness and destruction.**



“A tapestry version of the painting hangs at the United Nations Security Office in New York”



“Guernica was a Spanish town bombed during the Spanish Civil War on April 26, 1937”



Let's take a closer look!

**The painting is in black and white, like the newspapers of the time.
Picasso wanted to shout:
“This did not happen to war heroes but to innocent souls!
Women, children, animals!”**

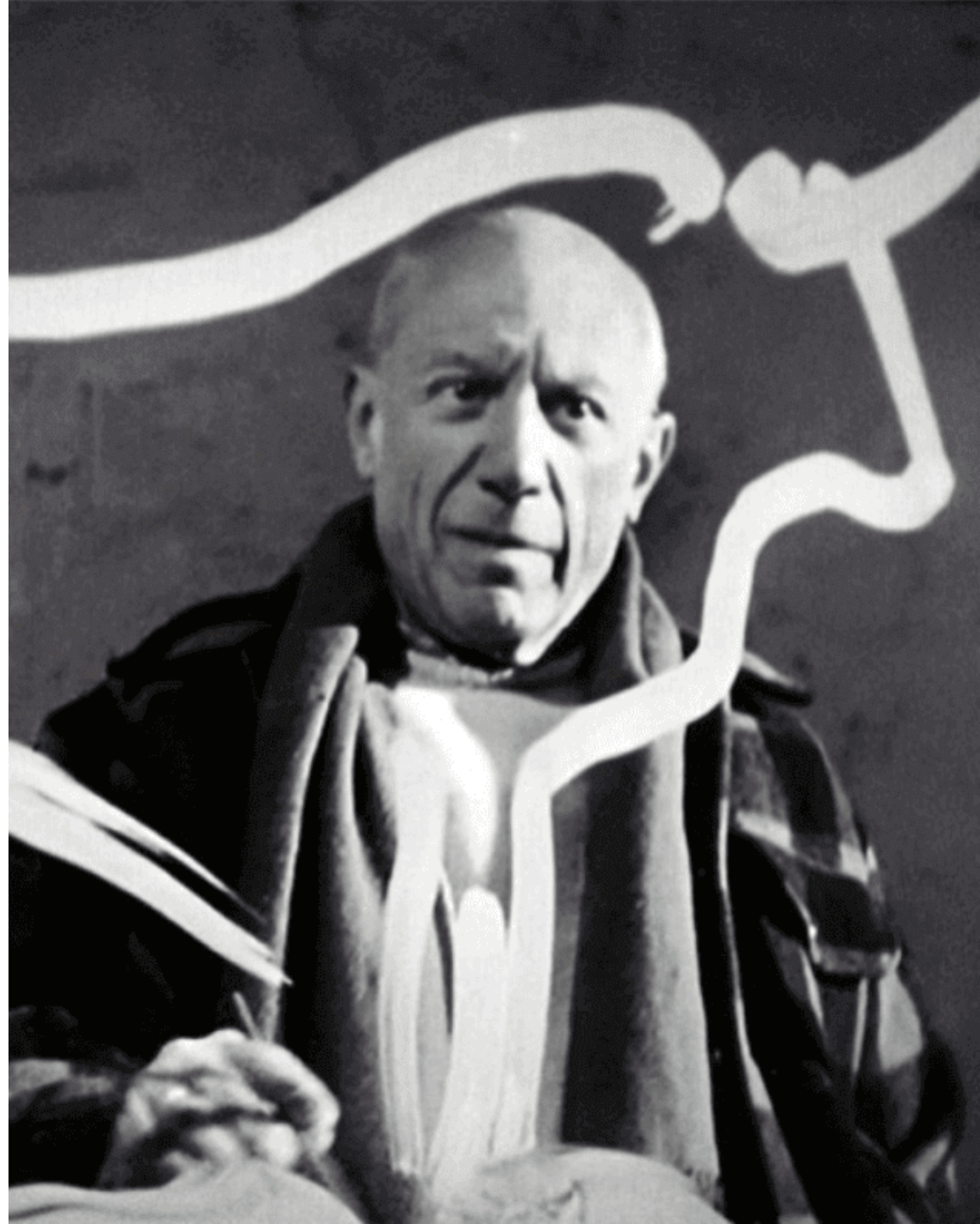

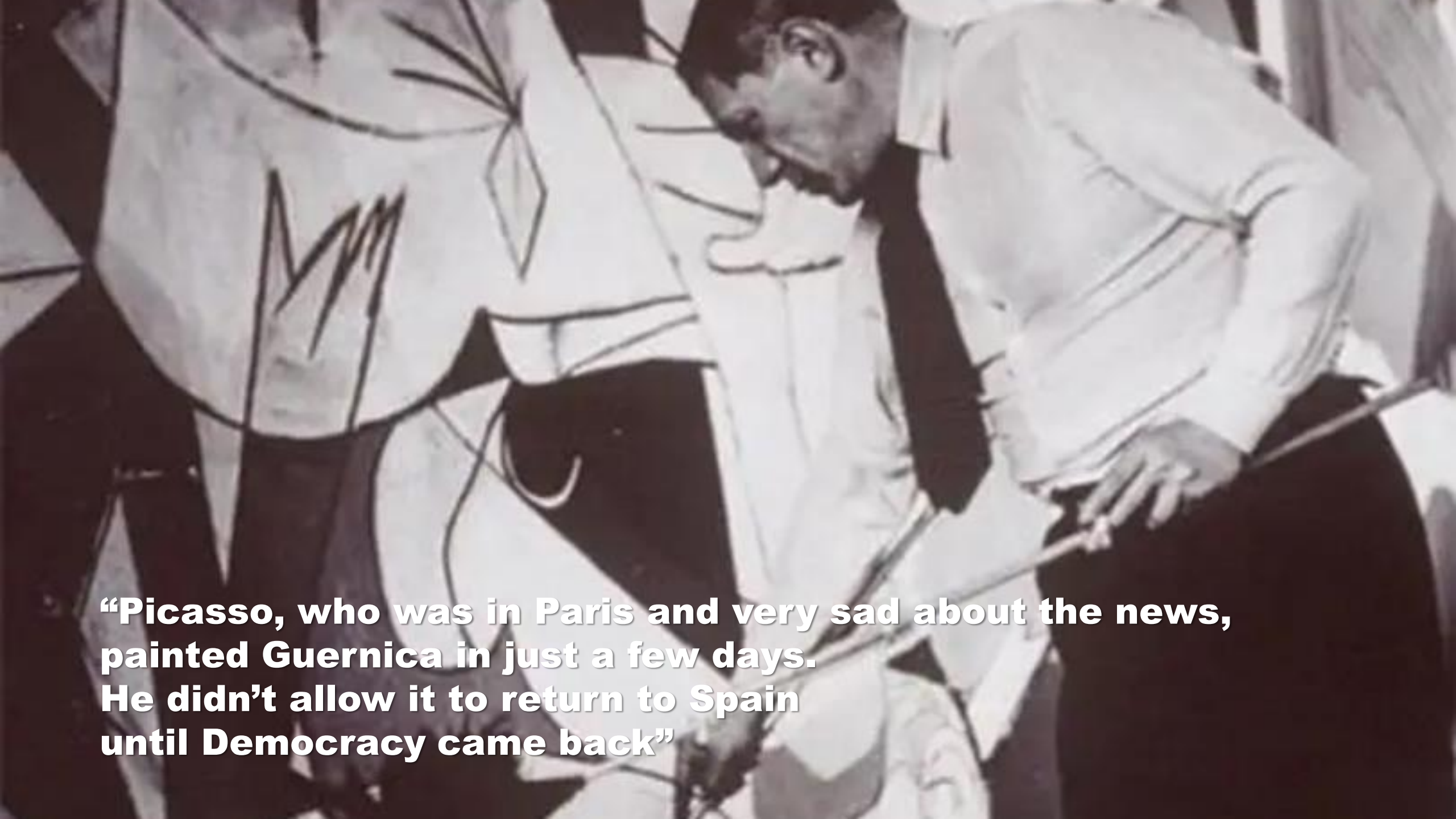
And the artist makes the first step by shouting out the truth!



The Bull in the painting tells the world about the horrible events that happened in Guernica.

The bull represents Picasso himself! The artist often included himself in his paintings as a bull a strong symbol of the proud Spanish Nation!





“Picasso, who was in Paris and very sad about the news, painted Guernica in just a few days. He didn’t allow it to return to Spain until Democracy came back”

**Picasso's "Dove" lithograph
was used to illustrate the poster
of the 1949 Paris Peace Congress**



Between 1949 and his death, Picasso created many works, including posters, prints and drawings, that showed the Dove of Peace. He was the one who gave it its modern political meaning!



He even named his daughter Paloma which is the Spanish word for pigeon
